**Ndese**

This community was chosen because students in Whitehorse, Canada have been sponsoring 3 Ugandan children from Ndese to go to school. One was collecting from a stagnant ditch and had become chronically ill from a bacterial infection in her spleen and amoebas in her stools. Hre two siblings had already died of water borne illness. The community was deemed at high risk as this ditch was their only source of water and was being shared with a herd of cows.

**Kisowera**

This community has had many years of cooperative ventures with the orphaned schoolchildren sponsored by the Whitehorse students in Canada. One of their sponsored children was removed from her home as it was determined she was in a high risk enviroment. Kisowera primary boarding school agreed to take her in and care for her for free for the first year. They have been asking Rotary for assistance to repair their damaged borehole so the 700+ schoolchildren and staff have access to clean drinking water. At the time of their assessment, they were collecting from a borehole that had rusted and was delivering yellow water with pieces of metal floating in it. The borehole in their school yard, that community members and those from the trading centre across the street had also been accessing, was not working.

A member of the Mukono Rotary projects committee, who works in the district water office as a District Health Inspector, oversaw the entire project. He was involved in discussions, hiring, decision making, assessing, technical support, evaluating, budgeting and purchasing. The chair of the projects committee was involved in the reporting. The president of the club was involved in all discussions and approved all decisions and budgets. The Mukono club has taken an active interest in the project and some members will visit the sites in the future.

An ex Rotarian from Whitehorse, Karen Smith, who has been involved with 4 previous borehole installations using Rotary funding, oversaw the entire project in conjunction with the Mukono Rotarians. She was involved in liasing with the Whitehorse Rotary Club, community discussions, decision making, assessing and reporting.

One Rotarian in Whitehorse was involved in project writing, budgeting, funding, accountabilities, photo documentation, reporting and acted as a liaison, via email, with Karen Smith.

Kisowera Primary School contributed an in kind donation to the cost of the borehole repairs at their school.
