Project Title: Rest/Picnic Shelters for Palmer, Alaska

Project Description

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place?

Provided three covered rest/picnic shelters for the community of Palmer, Alaska and its many visitors and tourists. A very popular event centered-community commons area in historic downtown Palmer, Alaska had no permanent resting accommodations.

2. How many people benefited from this project? Estimated census population is over 6500 people

3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met?

The greater community of Palmer and downtown city visitors. Three purchased and renovated covered rest/picnic shelters were placed in a very popular and frequently used commons area in the heart of the historic section of downtown Palmer. Previously, there was no seating or rest furniture available for those frequenting the popular area. The area is not only used for many special events, including local farmer and vender markets, beginning in May of each year through September/October, it is a popular lunch/break location for many local residents and area business employees. In addition, the commons area is directly across from Palmer's very busy Visitor and Historical Center, a center visited by thousands of visitors and tourists annually.

5. What did they do? Please give at least two examples, not including financial support provided to the project.

Performed refurbishment actions for purchased used rest/picnic shelters. The work for each shelter consisted of replacing old wood shingle roofing with Rotarian donated metal roofing and trim, replacing the below-ground cement based support columns, refurbishing/preparing new wood for the wood table top and seat benches, re-installing them, and re-painting of the entire structures.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The City of Palmer Public Works department provided significant assistance in helping prepare the structures for permanent in-ground placement, movement to the designated placement locations, and cement pouring to anchor each of the two supporting columns for each structure. Donated labor and materials were also provided by the local businesses of Magic Metals, Valley Block and Concrete, Alaska Pacific Rental and the local Alaska Job Corps Center.


