2. Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?

Foothills Rotary Christmas Basket Project 2023 focused on meeting a community need of providing food for a holiday meal and additional food items to help 80 families supplement meals during the winter break.

- With the increasing costs of groceries this project is very important to those experiencing food insecurity in our community.
- Our club fundraised \$3,445.38 to meet the District matching grant, provide additional grocery items not provided by the Food Bank of Larimer County, supplies needed for delivery and give a welcome donation to our local Food Bank.
- Our club negotiated with Safeway discounted food items to round our meals. Safeway also donated 100 reusable grocery bags to our cause.

- This year we worked with Neighbor to Neighbor, Care Housing, ChildSafe, and Mason Place, a supportive housing community. 80 families were given everything they needed for a holiday meal plus additional food to supplement their daily meals.
- Our prep day where we assemble the meals at the Food Bank of Larimer County included 16 volunteers with over 40 hours of service.
- Each family's meal had over 100 lbs. of food!
- The Food Bank supplied an incredible array of items this year and families that received the Holiday Baskets were overjoyed at the generous amounts provided.
- The day of delivery we had 20 volunteers that picked up the meals and delivered them to the families and worked a total of 67 hours. Volunteers were Rotary club members, their families, and friends

Volunteers helped pickup the food from Safeway, assembled 400 bags of food for distribution, and delivered to 80 families in our community.

This project provided a great relief to those experiencing food insecurity in our community. Each family received five bags filled with food plus a frozen turkey. The funds raised were used to match our grant, buy supplies needed to create the bags, buy additional groceries not available through the food bank and provide a welcome donation to the Food Bank of Larimer County.
