## Project Description

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place? If this is a progress report, what remains to be done? Whitehorse Yukon has a significant number of families living below the poverty line who cannot and do not provide sufficient food for their children unless provided by the Whitehorse Food Bank. These children go to school hungry and not properly dressed for the harsh winter conditions. This crisis impairs their ability to learn as well making them very vulnerable to illness. The Whitehorse Midnight Sun Rotary club will in collaboration with the Food Bank Executives determine the items of food and clothing required by these families. Rotarians will purchase the necessary items, deliver them to the Food Bank and participate in the fitting and issuance of the items purchased. This project will be afforded appropriate media coverage and serve as an illustration to the community of Rotarians contribution to the health and education of those less fortunate and in need. In consultation with the Management of the Whitehorse Food Bank it was determined that the people relying on the Food Bank would be best served if the Rotary Club provided food as the need for clothing items was fulfilled by other agencies. In view of the foregoing Rotary Club members purchased groceries valued in the amount of \$2,200.00 CAD which Rotarians delivered to the Food Bank and turned over to the management for distribution to those in need.

 Families in Whitehorse Yukon and area that live on incomes below the poverty line and due to their current situation are unable to, without assistance provide for themselves the foods essential to maintain good health.
