An Education Program for Underserved Youth Learning in a Whole New Way

Since 2007, Liberty School has provided access to art education to over 6,000 underserved youths. Students receive art lessons in music, dance, photography, improv, martial arts, writing, quilting, and more, at no charge to the students or schools. Youth from diverse backgrounds include military dependents and students from low-income families who face challenges including;

- a parent deployed for extended periods of time, creating single-parent households and experiencing periodic relocation
- frequent transition, inadequate housing, food insecurity, limited access to educational resources, safety and security concerns.

Focus on four core outcomes:

- To learn in new and creative ways,
- To promote a positive attitude toward learning,
- To increase self-esteem,
- And to encourage exploration of new possibilities for the future.
