Project Description

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place?

Working with four local elementary schools that receive Title I funds for disadvantaged children we provided winter clothing for children who come to school without adequate warm outer wear. We provided hats, gloves, snow pants and jackets. We provided the Street Outreach Advocacy Program (day program for homeless youth) with 223 pairs of warm gloves. The Door (overnight program homeless youth) received boots, snow pants, hats and gloves.

The clothing was purchased and distributed in Fairbanks Alaska for use in the winter of 2014-15.

2. How many people benefited from this project?

Approx 450

3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met?

The Title I School beneficiaries are children who come to school without adequate outerwear and are unable to play outside in the cold. The warm jackets, snow pants, hats and gloves enable them to join their friends in outside play and avoids the stigma of having to stay inside due to inadequate clothing. Fresh air and exercise provide both mental and physical benefits; with proper clothing the children were able to participate in outside activities on a daily basis.

The Street Outreach Advocacy Program (SOAP) provides daytime shelter and guidance for homeless teenagers. Due to the harsh climate in Fairbanks, Alaska, these teenagers risk frostbite without adequate winter gear. SOAP requested warm gloves for their clients and we provided 223 pairs.

The Door is an overnight shelter for homeless teenagers. We provided winter boots, hats, gloves and snow pants to ensure their clients are warm and do not risk frostbite.

Rotarians met with personnel at Title I schools, SOAP and The Door to determine their needs and then made multiple shopping and delivery trips to distribute the warm clothing.
