Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The project is to provide two \$1,500 scholarships to seniors in the Pilot Point Independent School District. The seniors are selected through an application process administered by the counselors at the PPISD High School. This process provides a non-biased approach to the distribution of the scholarships. Beginning in September two seniors are selected each month by the counselors from the applications and they are hosted by the Club at a monthly meeting. The seniors are asked to speak at the meetings and indicated the programs they are involved with at the High School and their intentions following graduation.

Once all of the seniors have visited the Club the counselors provide copies of the applications with all names removed. These applications are then reviewed and rated by a committee of Club members. Two are selected; one male and one female, and the counselors are notified of the selection. The two scholarships are then announced at a program recognizing all PPISD seniors.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 20

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

The Club works with the counselors from the Pilot Point High School to select two monthly Rotary Seniors. These seniors are then eligible to submit applications for two \$1,500 college scholarships for a total of \$3,000.

Club matching funds are raised through Club activities in the community such as the Flag Program.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? 2

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The Rotary club is an integral part of school activities. The members serve on committees at the high school, and work with the counselors in selecting the scholars. Students who receive these scholarships are able to continue their education to earn degrees and lead independent productive lives. Some of the scholars return to the community to be engaged citizens and leaders.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?


Counselors and Administrative staff with the Pilot Point Independent School District. Their role was to select the monthly Rotary Seniors through a non-biased application process.
