  - The Portneuf Rotary Club built a Born Learning Trail in partnership with the City of Pocatello Parks and Recreation Department, community volunteers, United Way of Southeastern Idaho. The trail is located in Raymond Park, Pocatello, Idaho.
- 4. In one brief sentence: who were the beneficiaries of the grant activities and how many of them were there?
  - Beneficiaries of the grant activities are the citizens of the City of Pocatello and visitors to Raymond Park, affecting over 71,000 people. The neighborhood surrounding the park has some of the lowest income families in the city.
- 5. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 9 (of 12) Briefly tell what did. Members prepared trail plans, purchased supplies, prepared the site, met with City officials and advocated for the trail before the City of Pocatello City Council, carried out the build, cleaned the site and conducted a public ribbon-cutting, prepared and carried out learning activities at the public event, secured press coverage and provided media interviews before, during and after the build.
- 6. If a cooperating organization(s) other than the beneficiary was involved, what was its role? United Way of Southeastern Idaho provided pedagogical background for all of the activities, design and curriculum development for all of the trail signs, a set of 3' x 3' stencils and instruction for trail surface images, the trail build guide, expertise on trail building, staffing for public launch; VolunteerUnited and JustServe.org posted the opportunities online; Idaho State University Male Nursing Association provided community volunteers.
