1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? Orange Plaza Rotary partnered with the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (HCC) and El Modena Alumni to mentor at-risk students enrolled in the Collaborative Technology Program (CTP) at El Modena High School in Orange, California. Five mentor dinners were held between October 2014 and March 2015. Mentors and students had lively table group discussions on a range of focus topics (see below). Monies also covered a mid-year progress celebration for the students. A new online scholarship application process was implemented this year. Scholarship applications have been reviewed and winners will be announced May 29.			

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? All 10 members participated 100% participation.
- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples?.
 - Mentors attended four dinners with the CTP juniors where each table grouping had a Rotary mentor, a school alumni mentor
 and 5-6 students. The club coordinated the food for all meals. Each evening had a focus introduced by a speaker: Community
 Service, Soft Skills, Social Media, and Goal Setting. Mentors then led table group discussions facilitated through ice-breakers
 and talking points.
 - Mentors had a reunion with last year's junior group (now seniors). The students discussed their post-secondary education and
 careers plans with the mentors. Mentors were asked to discuss and to stress the importance of networking with the students.
 - A team of Rotarians worked on the scholarship committee. One member developed a new online application process that was
 implemented. Another club member designed special certificates that a third member will present to student winners at El
 Modena High School's year-end awards program held at Chapman University. Orange Plaza Rotary will be listed in the program
 handed out at the event.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?
 - 34 high school juniors
 - 27 high school seniors
 - 4 CTP teachers
 - 6 El Modena High School Alumni Mentors (feel they got as much out of participation as they gave)
 - 2 Hispanic Chamber of Commerce members (giving back to the community)
- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The mentor sessions were well received by both the students and the teachers of the CTP program. Students, especially at-risk students, benefit from interaction with positive adult role models. It is important that students see that there are people in the community that care about them and that will take the time to get to know them, to spend time with them and to listen to them. Three students have been selected to receive scholarships to continue their education. For all three, they will be the first in their families to go to college.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and the El Modena High School Alumni also participated as mentors. The Hispanic Chamber is assuming responsibility for distribution of the scholarship funds through their Education Foundation, in addition to offering a \$500 scholarship.
