1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
Yearly Orange North and Orange Plaza Rotary Clubs work side by side with Police Explorers at community events in the City of Orange. Recognizing the tremendous number of volunteer hours worked by the Explorers, the Rotary clubs partnered to offer a scholarship program to members of Orange Police Explorer Post #266. In May, the six (6) Explorer scholarships winners were announced at a dinner in their honor. The scholarships totaled \$5500 and will be distributed by the Orange Police Explorer Post #266 when the students show enrollment in a post secondary school program.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

- Orange North Rotary – 7 members
- Orange Plaza Rotary – 9 members

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

- All members from both clubs worked with Explorers at community events in the City of Orange - Orange North Rotary at the Tree Lighting and the International Street Fair and Orange Plaza Rotary at Treats in the Streets and The Plaza Car Show.
- A committee made up of representatives from both clubs met with Orange Police Department Explorer Advisers to establish criteria for the scholarship program. An online application was developed. Members then visited an Explorer meeting to thank them for their many hours of service to the community and to announce the new scholarship program.
- Applications were reviewed and winners selected. Members then planned an awards dinner. The dinner attendees included Rotary members from Orange North and Orange Plaza, the 6 Explorer scholarship winners and their families, additional members of Explorer Post #266 and 5 representatives from the Orange Police Department that serve as advisers to the Explorers.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

The entire 25 members of the Orange Police Department Explorer Post #266 benefited from acknowledgment that their hours of community service are recognized and appreciated. Six Explorers, however, will benefit from the \$5500 in scholarship funds that enables them to continue their education. Several winners will be the first in their families to go to college.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The collaboration between the Rotary clubs and the Police Department definitely strengthened our working relationship. The OPD representatives were so enthusiastic and supportive at the awards dinner that Orange Plaza has decided to continue the Scholarship Program within our regular budget.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The Orange Police Department was very supportive. Their role included; help establishing scholarship criteria, working with the Explorers to complete the applications (many had never applied for scholarships previously), participating in the review and selection of winners, and attending the awards dinner celebration. The OPD has also accepted responsibility for distribution of the scholarship funds when the students show proof of post-secondary school attendance.
