3. Briefly describe your project (who did what, when and where did project activities take place?) in 100 words or less. District provided \$2,000 in matching funds and the local club provided \$2,000; this money went to Ghana along with about 15 volunteers from Idaho; at the orphanage/school, the volunteers landscaped the barren ground, planted grass, helped install cement sidewalks, and installed a retaining wall; all to make the property more child friendly, safe, and clean.
4. In one brief sentence: who were the beneficiaries of the grant activities and how many of them were there? The children who live at the orphanage and the local other children that come to the school; over 100 current children and thousands over the years to come.
5. How many Rotarians participated in the project? All 30 of the Blackfoot Club members participated in the planning and financing. Briefly tell what did. Identified the project, found people willing to go do the project in Ghana (at their own travel expense), raised funds through various fund raising activities, and sent the money and people to do the project.
6. If a cooperating organization(s) other than the beneficiary was involved, what was its role? Ghana Make A Difference is a non-profit entity located in Star Idaho with its board of directors composed mostly of local people from Ghana; this entity purchased land, built a school and home/orphanage in Ghana and operates this facility with local people and certain improvement projects are carried out and completed by volunteers from Idaho and other places. In this project, the property in Ghana needed some landscaping, curbing and sidewalks and retaining walls at the site to prevent erosion, make the area more child friendly and safe, and to improve the services given by this entity to the local children in Ghana – see the before and after pictures.
