February 2015 – Contacted Forest Service Rozie Berry, MG Civil Engineering Tech who advised he would be very happy to help with the project. Received an e-mail in April after repeated phone calls that said no he was unable to help with the project.

March 2015 – Attended PETS/discussed grants and projects. Still had no idea how much the project would cost but requested \$3,000 to offset the amount of money we would be spending on the project.

April received an e-mail requesting the project on line be signed.

May continued to try to reach the Forest Service regarding this project.

June contacted Forest Ranger to discuss the project. Left a phone message. Received a telephone call from Jon Regetz Trails Manager / Acting Developed Recreation Program Manager, who noted he would review the project to see what was needed. He e-mailed in July letting us know a new roof was needed, asked for a new horse shoe area that keeps getting washed out due to high water in the fall. And noted a new picnic table would be needed.

October – received funding for Grant from District -\$3,000
