Project Description

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place?

Project is to build a shelter and install a public street piano in Whitehorse.

Note: This project is not complete. The costs reported are only for the break-proof glass which has been shipped to the company that will build the shelter. Other costs still for the construction of the metal bus shelter and transportation. We anticipate that it will be another 6 months before this project is considered complete and will be installed for summer 2017. This is owing to extensive delays in securing approval for the land by the Yukon government which delayed securing estimates for the construction of the shelter. Additional delays are being encountered as final size and design of the shelter is confirmed with the supplier.

3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met?

Will be for any Whitehorse citizens and visitors to the community who play piano and want to enjoy music.


