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
Dear Ms. Dimas-Peinado:

We are pleased to report that funding from the Rotary Club of Whittier in the amount of \$8,258, and from Pacific Western Bank in amount of \$1,500, have been fully expended. This generous funding was applied towards our School-Based Oral Health & Nutrition Program for the children of Whittier, through Rotary Club of Whittier's "Healthy Smiles, Healthy Children Project." On behalf of our Board of Directors, staff and the children we serve, *THANK YOU!*

During the months of January and February of this year, our Oral Health Education team provided five School-Based Oral Health and Nutrition days at two Whittier schools: Sorenson Elementary School and Longfellow Elementary School. Overall, our team provided 1,115 students in 41 classrooms with Oral Health Education and Oral Health Kits; where 264 students (those who returned permission slips) received dental health screenings and fluoride varnish application. All students were given 30-minutes of oral health education, a take home oral health kit, and Oral Health information in English and Spanish.





Attached, please find a spreadsheet recording the number of children served and results of each Oral Health and Screening Day. Overall, 43% of students screened needed dental work, with 3% in urgent need right now. Please note that "Needing dental work" means treatment such as a filling, extraction, or space maintainer. Urgent needs students were identified as having a visible tooth infection, such as swelling, dental abscesses, or a toothache. All original permission slips were left with the school's health aide who coordinated this project. The school's Health Aide will contact the parents to confirm that they have sought treatment. Follow up will be completed by the school and CDHC personnel, as needed. To ensure that families are aware of resources, an Area Dental Resources flyer was sent home with every child screened, and was made available at the school health office.

In addition, the top two classes that returned permission slips on time, whether parents said "yes" or "no" to screening, received a prize. We were happy to present an IPad to the class winning first place and a \$75 Target Gift Card for the class winning second place.

Once again, we are grateful for support from the Rotary Club of Whittier for this generous support. We have also attached our budget representing expended funding for this project.
