## Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

This project is in it's ninth year. The first year dictionary recipients are graduating HS this year. Each year since, we have given a dictionary to every third grade student in the Denton Independent School District (ISD). For a 2nd year we expanded the program to include all third graders in the Lake Dallas ISD, plus this year, Sanger ISD, KOAN school and the Catholic school $3^{\text {rd }}$ graders. This came to 28 presentations throughout the school year. We also give a dictionary to each teacher and principal. Approximately 2300 Denton ISD students, 330 Lake Dallas ISD students, 50 Sanger students, 35 Catholic school students and 7 Koan school students received a dictionary this year totaling over 2700 .

    1) Attended and distributed books at one or more elementary school presentations with that schools third graders and their teachers gathered to receive their dictionaries.

    4) Our Dictionary project leader sent around a sign up sheet with the names of all the elementary schools, where Rotarians signed up for either a specific school or to be available for any school.
    5) First person for a school was the school leader and assigned to contact the principal to schedule the assembly of all the third graders for a particular day. This leader then contacted several Rotarians to meet on the assigned day at the elementary school for the presentation and distribution. Most presentation groups had an average of 4 Rotarians at the presentation. Some Rotarians presented at more than one school.
