The project will eliminate chances of diseases like diarrhea, cholera, typhoid, dengue etc. The project will also bring a tangible change and improvement in the living conditions of the people for whom toilets and the wash facilities are being created. The survey has been conducted by the Rotarians who have identified the slum areas/villages/schools. The survey has revealed very touching stories which reveal deaths of infants and pregnant women because of insanitary conditions.

This is a problem at the National Level that people do not have toilets in their homes and they go in the open for defecation. The team mentioned in the grant had frequented the area identified and thought of the present project.

TRF reserves the right to cancel the grant and/or this Agreement without notice upon the failure of either or both of the Sponsors to abide by the terms set forth in this Agreement and the Terms and Conditions. Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund of any global grant funds, including any interest earned,

that have not been expended.

- 7. The laws of the State of Illinois, USA, without reference to its conflicts of laws principles, shall govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.
- 8.
