Recover coffee production in Quindío. Motivate the generational union of farmers so that the young person is more inclined to continue in the coffee business. Continue with the idea of the mother's legacy to her children. Find alternative income for small coffee producers with temporary crops to sell and eat, while the production of the new crop begins. Provide housing stability in the countryside and thus contribute to curbing the migration of young people from the countryside to the cities. Change the techniques for washing and drying coffee in the mills, making it more attractive to new generations of growers; revitalize the coffee plantation by cultivating new production alternatives such as corn and beans. Expand the department's coffee park, contributing to the sustainability of the Colombian Coffee Cultural Passage.
