LOS JARDINES,
SANTA MARIA DISTRICT, PERU

The Community of Los Jardines is located on a hill beside the Pan-American Highway



This project will tap into an existing spring located next to the nearby Huaura River and use solar power to pump the water to an elevated reservoir, from where the water will flow to 88 homes



The community will contribute hundreds of hours of labour to dig the trenches for the water pipes.



After chlorination, each of the 88 households in Los Jardines will be supplied with gravity-fed water to a faucet at their home

This NGO has been working in Peru over the past 50 years.

They have completed several hundred water projects on the coast, in the Andes, and in the Amazon basin of Peru.

Since 2000, Alas has installed approx. 30 water projects near the Barranca area on the coast of Peru, all of which are currently still functioning. Thousands of people now have clean water.

All water projects are only undertaken if there is a local water committee composed of at least 50% women from the community.

All community members are given training on hygiene and the proper use of potable water.

The community will take ownership of the project by contributing many hours of unskilled labour toward the project and having a trained water committee.

Funding for the El Porvenir water project

The **Castlegar Rotary club** will be the **International Club**

The **Huacho Rotary club** will be the **Host Club**

Total cost: \$116,000.00 US

The Montreal Rotary Club will contribute 50% of total funds

The Castlegar Rotary Club is responsible for raising 50% of funds through cash contributions from Rotary clubs, matching DDF grants and matching grants from the Global Fund.

We are looking for partnering Rotary Clubs to commit funds to this project. We need a commitment of approx. \$20,700 US, which, when combined with matching DDF and Global funds, will give us the required amount.

The Castlegar club will take on the responsibility for all grant writing, financial accounting and report writing.

We will be helping residents of Los Jardines to obtain a desperately needed source of clean water.

This will help them avoid water-borne diseases and free them from the daily chore of finding water, some of which must be collected from the near-by contaminated river and then transported to their homes.
