



Wunlang Village

In 2011 Wunlang completed the construction of their village health center (see picture above) with support from the local community and their NGO partner. The health facility consists of a single-story building with 6 rooms totaling about 2900 sq. ft. of floor space. Although the space is used by the local health workers, the rooms are unfurnished, and people sit on the floor (see picture below). The village is now trying to acquire the furniture, medical equipment, and supplies they need to make the clinic fully operational and extend services in the community.

A well-equipped PHCC will help transform Wunlang into a health care hub for the area--- improving access to and quality of care for the whole region.

WHO BENEFITS:

Wunlang is a rural village in South Sudan - one of the poorest places in the world. It is located in Aweil East County, Northern Bahr el Ghazal state. There are 10 states in South Sudan. Aweil East is one of 5 counties in the state.

There are approximately 500 families in Wunlang village. With an average household size of 8, we estimate direct beneficiaries in the village to be about 4000 consisting of 500 adult males, 500 adult females, and 3000 children. Gender distribution is about 50-50 males to females.
