

Rules and Guidelines for Use of the Matching Grants Website

The Matching Grants Website at www.MatchingGrants.org is provided as a free service to Rotarians worldwide who want to do Global Grants and District Grants.

Use of the website is for Rotarians only and the project partners working with them on Rotary projects.

By submitting a project on this website, or as a project participant for an existing project you acknowledge and agree that:

1. You will make the necessary updates to keep the project page current until completion of the project. This is true whether you find the financing for the project through this website or not. See www.MatchingGrants.org/global/quicktips.html#4 for more information.
2. You will not request that a project be dropped from the website if it has been completed or is in the process of completion as a District Grant or Global Grant. Instead, you will update the project page to reflect the current financing and current project status.
3. You will notification notification emails sent by the system to inform you of specific changes to your project, or to remind you that the project pages need to be updated on a regular basis. You will not report these emails as spam to your email provider, as this would damage the reputation of the website as a sender of email communications. 4. You will enter valid and current information, including all email addresses. You will not enter dummy email addresses. All provided email addresses (whether it is yours or not) must be valid email addresses to the best of your knowledge. Invalid email addresses would lead to bounced emails which would damage the reputation of the website as a sender of email communications.
5. You will provide all the project information in English. The website is designed to reach the widest audience possible and need to be consistent and use the widest accessible language.

Failure to follow these guidelines can lead to having your account and your email address banned from using the website, as decided by the website creator, PDG Philippe Lamoise.
