The funds enabled the Clearview Library District to offer the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program, a national program to encourage early literacy, to the families of young children in our library district. The grant paid for prizes to encourage the kids and parents to keep reading picture books and paid for an entertainer for the first group of finishers to celebrate their accomplishment. The activities took place in the library and on the library's bookmobile. The library staff were involved.

By encouraging young children to read and love the written word, we are helping them to be successful in school and in life.

The Clearview Library District Staff worked with the parents and children, signing them up for the program, distributing prizes at milestones and conducting the finishers party for the first group of children who read 1000 books.
