The long- term impact will encourage children to read earlier, or simply to read. This allows the person as an adult to recognize opportunities for employment later in their lives, and to be affective at their work. This will improve the health, safety and welfare of the population in general. It will decrease homelessness, and crime as well. The ability to read increases earning potential, therefore creating opportunities. Through reading, one learns about conflict resolution to create peace, what causes disease, and creates health and prosperity.
