### Project Description:

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1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

This project partnered with Lincoln County School District #1 to provide playground equipment for local elementary schools in Kemmerer, WY. Project funds (\$1000 District Centennial Grant and \$500 matching club funds) purchased 2 portable basketball hoops for Kemmerer Elementary (grades K-2) and, with additional funding from LCSD#1, purchased a swing set and 2 nest swings for Canyon Elementary (grades 3-6). School District personnel assisted with identification of the need and implementation of the project as well as arranging for setting up the equipment on the playgrounds.

3. What did or will they do? Please give at least two examples.

The Superintendent and Canyon Elementary School Principal are Rotarians. As such, they played an important role in identifying the need for additional playground equipment as well as selection, purchase and placement of the equipment.

On a designated date when school is in session, Rotarians will visit the playground and use various media to make the community aware of this Rotary project.

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is or will be the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The current and future students of the elementary schools will have increased opportunities for physical exercise and play, both of which are important for good health and learning.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

Lincoln County School District #1 partnered with Rotary on this project and provided input on what students needed as well as administrative and maintenance personnel to order and place the playground equipment. The original budget called for a one-bay swing set; however, the district was able to almost match Rotary project funds resulting in a larger, 2-bay swing set being purchased.
