Shoes for Kids

- Started in 2015
- Provides new shoes to local school kids
 - 3 Elementary Schools
 - 2 Rural single classroom schools
 - 1 Middle School
- Need is determined with the help of the school counselors and administrators, they also measure the feet of the kids

Once a Year

- The shoes are purchased once a year in the fall, along with socks
- Many of the children are still wearing the shoes we gave them the previous year
 - Too small
 - Holes, and worn out soles
- The younger kids show off the new shoes and brag about them to their classmates

Lost of Shoes

- In 2017 the program provided:
 - 100 pairs of shoes
 - 15 pairs of snow boots
 - About 200 pairs of socks
