We review our scholarships that are administered by the Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley (3). We decide what areas in education that we want to emphasize. 2-3 board members meet with the Foundation to review our criteria and what funds will be paid out. At that point our Board votes to apply for the matching grant dollars and insert into our budget.

- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? Our Rotary Club seeks to be known as supporting scholarship in our local community. We are very visible in the community through our involvement with the Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley Through them we look to fund scholarships that meet the student's financial needs but as important we fund areas of education that reflect the "Service Above Self" motto of Rotary. This needs-based scholarship requires the student to study in the social studies area. The student will report to us as to their progress. This information is shared with our Club.

  The Community Foundation of the Fox River Valley manages our funds and interviews and chooses a qualified candidate (independent of our Club).
