1.	Briefly describe the project. What was done and where did the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were involved?		
	Buddy Benches were placed in the community. Although the initial plan was to place them all in city parks, the city was less than easy to work with, so one was placed in Avery Park (this took over a year to implement with the legal and regulatory requirements). The additional two benches were placed in elementary schools. The school district assembled their two benches after delivery and installed them at no cost to us. Students at Centennial high school were involved in developing the plaque crediting Rotary for the benches.

	Dave Boon contacted the city of Fort Collins Parks and Recreation Dept and worked with the director to design and locate the benches  The city would only place 1 bench at this time - Avery Park (we thought we had an agreement for more)  So then June Boon contacted the Poudre School district to place the additional 2 benches.  The school district identified two schools that would be happy to have them (Putnam and Beattie Elementary Schools)  Someone worked with Centennial High School to create the Rotary Plaques for the benches, picked them up and brought them to the school district who assembled the benches and affixed the plaques.

Everyone who goes to the newly rejuvenated 17-acre Avery Park in Fort Collins and every child that attends Putnam and Beattie Elementary schools

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is the expected long-term community impact of this project?

The bench in Avery Park is located by the playground and every child that plays there and their parents can benefit from this bench as a place to watch their children or to simply rest after play. This park has been newly updated with new playgrounds and ball and soccer fields. Because it is labelled as a Buddy Bench the hope is it will promote friendship and inclusion in the park. It is located where it is handicapped accessible as well.

The schools that received the benches will benefit because it will promote friendships and inclusion for the children that attend now and for years into the future.

Each bench has a warranty of 50 years and is made from recycled plastics.
