Project Title: Interact Archie Neil Park

### Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

The Interact Club sponsored by the Rotary Club of Kemmerer WY coordinated with the City of Kemmerer to make improvements to concessions facilities at Archie Neil Park, a city-operated park. The concessions facilities that serve the park and the outdoor swimming pool are made available at no cost to youth organizations (school groups, scouts, clubs, etc.) for fundraising activities. Interact students, with Rotarian sponsors, repaired/refurbished picnic tables and added storage capacity to the facilities. The much-improved facilities will provide a safer, more inviting spot for concessions sales, benefitting both consumers and the youth organizations that provide the sales items.

3. What did or will they do? Please give at least two examples.

As part of the planning process, Interact students made a presentation at a regular meeting of the Kemmerer City Council. They outlined their objectives and how they intended to achieve them. They made a similar presentation to the Kemmerer Rotary Club.

To execute the project, Interact students were entirely hands-on. They measured and calculated what materials they needed, contacted vendors and placed orders, removed and

replaced boards in the picnic tables, sanded and painted table legs, and assembled storage cabinets.

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is or will be the expected long-term community impact of this project?

Beneficiaries are the youth organizations that will almost certainly sell more products in this updated, fresh venue and by doing so, advance the good work that they do. Everyone who sits down to have a snack or picnic in Archie Neil Park is a beneficiary as well. The refurbished tables are exponentially more inviting.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

The City of Kemmerer coordinated with Interact to determine what was needed in Archie Neil Park to upgrade the concessions facility. Maintenance crews removed the discarded wood, and they will secure the storage cabinets to the wall of the concessions building.

When they needed some additional funds to meet their \$300+ obligation, they earned \$100 by cleaning a local building. The original project budget included funds to rehab 3 picnic tables; however, after students made their presentation to the City of Kemmerer, the City contributed \$350 to the project budget to allow students to rehab all 6 tables.

In retrospect, it would have been good if the local newspaper had been invited to cover the project as it was happening. Pictures and the story will be sent to the newspaper now.
