Our two Club members were joined in Honduras by Rotarians from two other

District 6450 Clubs, specifically Darien and La Grange. This team met with local Rotarians, government officials, and staff from Schools for the Children of the World in Honduras. Together they visited a number of cities, viewed existing conditions, and developed plans to create a series of Rotary Foundation Simple School Global Grants. Following the investigative trip, four Global Grants have been created for the cities of

- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? Long term benefits will include improvements in the children's basic education leading to improved economic, health, and long-term overall society benefits.
- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? Schools for the Children of the World was and remains an important cooperating organization in Honduras. They have experienced, talented people located and actively involved in Honduras, and they have knowledge of local construction contacts plus government authorities.
- 7. How did you share the news of your project? **Both locally and in Honduras, articles were written and** published telling about the projects and what impact they would have.
