Project Title: VIP Project (Flu Vaccines for all Campbell County School District

Students).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

1. Briefly describe the project: A total of 2507 vaccines were given in September, October and November of 2018. This was a five percent increase over 2017, with 125 more children receiving vaccines.

Six hundred and thirty one (631) of those vaccines were from the VFC Federal Immunization program. The VFC vaccines stretch the school vaccines by providing vaccine to children who quality for the federal program. No child receiving vaccine has to pay for their vaccine, regardless which program their vaccine is from.

We brought 124 doses back to the office that was left for the project. All the vaccine was used prior to Christmas, 2018.

- 2. How many Rotarians participated in this project? Members of the Energy Rotary Club signed up to assist at each of the schools, approximately 16 members. All the schools, elementary, secondary, Westwood Alternative High School, Youth Emergency Services school and John Paul II elementary school received vaccines for all students who signed up to receive shots.
- 3. What did they do? (two activities)
 Approximately 16 Rotarians assisted at these schools, either working with counselors, nurses or administrators. We handed out paperwork, got students to the right places in the school and assisted elementary school children who were crying or extremely frightened about getting a shot.

The director of the VIP Project is a member of Gillette Energy Rotary. Nachelle McGrath organizes, supervises, fund-raises, does the accounting, scheduling and overall manages the entire program.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? The families of the 2507 students who received the vaccines benefitted, as did families and individuals who come into contact with these student. Not sure how one would track the impact of such an important project.

- 5. What is the expected long-term community impact of this project:
 Preventing Influenza within the schools, as much as possible, has a positive impact on the entire community. Obviously, anytime prevention of disease of any type is beneficial for the community and all of the population.
 Unfortunately, this project is not complete after one flu season, but will need to be revisited next year and following years..
