Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)? This project helped cover costs associated with the purchase and installation of two roll-up warehouse doors for the Valley View Community Food Bank's new 5,000sqft distribution warehouse located in El Mirage, AZ.

When (dates) and where (city, state and country) did project activities take place?

The project lasted from November 2021 to January 2022. The project took place in El Mirage, AZ United States of America.

Who were the beneficiaries? The beneficiaries are residents living in the Phoenix West Valley and other communities within the state of Arizona that are receiving food assistance through the Valley View Community Food Bank.

- 3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples. All our club members participated in club meeting fundraisers, which included "Happy Bucks" donations and raffles. Jon provided regular communications, updates, along with progress photos to all involved. COVID restrictions unfortunately prohibited more active fundraising opportunities. Participation in the actual usage of the new warehouse facility for volunteer activities will be endless and not limited strictly to the Rotary Club of Surprise Sunset exclusively, but will include the overall volunteer community at large.
- 4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? This is currently an unidentifiable statistic because the numbers of beneficiaries will continue to grow exponentially as the warehouse is in operational use throughout the years to come. The Valley View Community Food Bank is the largest food distributor in the Phoenix West Valley. In 2021, 712,663 clients from all communities in the West Valley were served through the distribution of over 1 million tons of food. There were 413,631 clients under the age of 55 years and 299,557 clients over 55 years of age.

- 5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? The long-term impacts associated with assisting in the overall warehouse project, will enable the food bank the ability to receive more food to distribute to those in need without having to turn down donations due to lack of warehousing space. There will also be ongoing support through onsite volunteer activities directly associated with the Valley View Community Food Bank to its clients and other Phoenix Valley food banks and pantries.
- 6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? Southwest Building Solutions, LLC provided the supplies and labor associated with the construction of the new warehouse.
