Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Shiloh Field Community Garden grows fruits and vegetables for 15 nonprofit pantries and kitchens across Denton County. Their goal is to produce 60 to 80,000 pounds of produce a year. Shiloh Field is the largest community garden in the United States. \$3,000 funded an irrigation system for the new field blocks that can be installed in October 2021. This funding will cover the cost of tubing, sprinkler heads, and controls. Water supply to the field already exists. Once installed, the irrigation system will sustain the field blocks for years to come.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 50

12 Rotarians spent time at Shiloh Gardens moving dirt and building raised planting beds. We watched the new sprinkler units.
