# PART 1

## About Us

Established in 1994, Shri. B. D. Tatti (Annavaru) Memorial Charitable Trust works for the welfare and development of persons with disabilities in Karnataka. The founders of the Trust began its work by working for children with speech and hearing impairment. Over the years, the Trust rapidly expanded its work and has reached out to about 8000 persons with disabilities, including children, youth and adults in 11 Districts of Karnataka till date.

## Objectives

- ▶ To ensure early identification of children with disability, assess their needs, and accordingly facilitate the process to provide them with the relevant service.
- To prepare children with disability to mainstream in regular Educational Institutions.
- To identify youth and adults with disability, and assess their needs.
- ► To support youth with disability to pursue higher education, facilitate or provide vocational training, and income generation opportunities through placement or self- employment.
- > To provide appropriate mobility aids and appliances to the needy
- ▶ To promote and establish networks to assist persons with disability at the family, institution and community level.
- To provide therapy services (physio and speech) to persons with disability
- To create a technology friendly environment to the disabled community

# **PART 2** Institutional Based Programmes

## A. 1. Sushravya Pre-Primary School for Deaf (Mother Care Center)

It started in 2007-08 the only centre in North Karnataka to provide oral deaf language training to hearing impaired children and their mothers. Children with hearing impairment, who are as young as six months to five years old, are enrolled in the school along with their mothers.

Children with hearing impaired and their mothers learn the basics of oral deaf language and begin to communicate with each other in batches from three years. The mothers often interact with the children of other women as it not only expands the scope of communication but also improves the overall morale and confidence. The capacities of the mothers as resource persons also get developed in the process.

Apart from this, the children and mothers have opportunities for orientation & exposure to various to places like offices, shops, local events, fairs, functions, and scenic places. This helps them to develop observation power and enriches the understanding in the children about daily life. During this year, the children visited a vessels shop, a tailor shop, and a grocery store. They also visited places of worship of different religions such as Dargahs, Churches and Temples. A visit to the local bakery was of great interest. They were also explained about the construction of a road in the city.

Such exposure visits enthuses the children, and instills a positive energy and confidence in both mother and children.

## First time I heard the word "AMMA"

My Son was not showing the usual signs of development and speech even at two and half years of age.A staff member of Shri. B. D. Tatti (Annavaru) Memorial Charitable Trust CBR worker interacts regularly with the Anganwadi worker. They both came to visit my son at our home and explained about Sushravya Pre Primary school. My son and I joined the 'Sushravya'after we learnt about the services. Now there is great improvement in my son. He interacts and is able to speak. And now he is studying in Normal School







## Facilities and services at 'Sushravya'


- Residential facilities for mother and child
- Auditory training
- Hearing testing
- Oral deaf education training due to which children are able to talk the important basic words, communicate and understand most of daily use words. These includes names of vegetables, flowers, names of festivals, musical instruments, identify the source of sound during experiments etc. During this year, a total of 22children (14 were boys and 8 were girls) studied in the course. Till date, about 82 children have passed out from Sushravya Pre-primary and mainstreamed in schools.



## A. 2. Shri B D Tatti Residential School for Children with Hearing Impairment

The B. D. Tatti Residential School for Children with Hearing Impairment provides education from 1st Standard to 10th Standard, and teaches all the subjects. The school is affiliated to Department of Women and Child Welfare, Government of Karnataka. The teachers' training skills are upgraded regularly to improve the teaching methodologies to children with speech and hearing impairment. The school follows the Nali-Kali method of teaching which is appropriate to teach students, especially those with Hearing Impairment at an early age which was introduced.







## Academics

193 students with hearing impairment studied in BDT Residential School for the academic year 2018-19. 25 students appeared for the school finals exams and secured 96 % results. The student who scored the highest got 76.47% marks for the year 2018-19.

Sports

The children are regularly participating in yoga and various sports in the campus. At the crack of the dawn, children play and practice running on the large field. They also do 'Yoga' & an intense but quick practice session on the Mallakamba ensures that the expertise of the children is developed day after day. The positive impact of play, sports and yoga is evident as the children are now less immune to illness, have a healthy appetite, and have healthy growth indicators. Mallakamba helps to build confidence, courage and skill enhancement among children. Mallakhamba, also known as pole gymnastics, is a traditional Indian sport in which a gymnast performs feats and poses with a vertical wooden pole or rope. Mallakhamba derives from the terms 'Malla' which means a wrestler and 'Kamba' means pole.







# **PART 3** Community based Rehabilitation Program

## Introduction

Shri. B. D. Tatti (Annavaru) Memorial Charitable Trust implementing its community based rehabilitation programs in Shirahatti Tulak, Mundargi Taluk and Laxmeshwar Taluak of Gadag District.

The need for timely identification of persons with disabilities, providing them with the range of services required and expanding the reach of service to direct and indirect beneficiaries. These programmes provided the scope to involve and engage with various stakeholders, care givers, Government Departments and NGOs in the service of persons with disabilities.

## Key programs

#### Early Intervention and Early Education Program

B. D. Tatti strengthened the Early Intervention and Early Education Programme in Laxmeshwar with the support of APPI (Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives) in April 2016 which was facilitated by APD, organized capacity building program to all the project staff along with the field follow support work . Covering 92 villages in Shirahatti Taluka, this is a 5 years project reaching out to 300 children end of 2020.

## Early Intervention & Early Education services by Covering 56 Villages at Mundaragi Taluka, Gadag

Early Intervention & Early Education services by Covering 56 Villages at Mundaragi Taluka, Gadag. During 2017-18 the delay development children of 0-6 years identified & intervened through community based and centre based approach supported by Deshpande Foundation Hubli with technical support from Tamahar Trust Bangalore.

The programme is efficient for those who detected early and get early intervened are benefitted. BDT following the strategy of screening the children for early identification &those who identified through screening will be assessed for appliance and therapy and do constant follow up for further interventions. Early education is the unique program for the disable children who left or who perceive the education in the school in their early age. It also educates caregivers on the basic requirements for their day to day disability management and creating awareness about various schemes from the government and other organization. And mainly it is kind of social entrepreneurship models where people will pay for the service in order to sustain the organisation.







## Impact of the program at Laxmeshwar Taluk

- Created SPG model At Mulagund Taluk.





## Impact of the program at Mundaragi Taluk

- Out of 10800 screening, 250 children with delay development identified.
- Conducting regular parents trainings and motivation is been given to change the perspective of the rural parents/caregivers.
- Often trainings and support to ASHA workers, Gram panchayath members, Doctors, RBSK Team and parents.
- Corrective surgeries been done to the delay development children.
- Entrepreneurship Model is been impacted in the rural part.
- Three sub centres has been opened.

## Therapy and Mobility Service

Therapy (physiotherapy and speech therapy) is very important to improve the lives of persons with physical and speech related disability, especially for children in their early age. The organization is actively working with health care centers and also visiting the houses of the children with disability in order to provide the required physiotherapy and speech therapy. There is an improvement in the condition of the beneficiaries after therapy service. During the year, the following Mobility Devices were given to Beneficiaries.

## Livelihood

Livelihood program is for the adults with the age of 18+& the program is supported by Enable India, Bangalore. It is a centre where we connect with companies and the differently able people to create opportunities for livelihood. Where we provide skills to differently able people and place them job to the companies. It is a pilot project where BDT needs to learn and experiment more in this space.

### Success Stories

#### Sharanu Bhajantri Shigli 🕨

The child enrolled to BDT at the age of three years& was diagnosed with Developmental Delay. One of BDT staff had identified his during the home visit and assessed. He was completely dependent on others for all his needs. He was not able to sit and stand properly. It was observed that he had no social skills, self-care, attention and interest in his activities. As per the plan & guidance, BDT staff visited weekly twice to provide service at his home.

The child fitted with appliances provided by BDT. Now he is able to walk and has developed the activities like feeding, toileting, playing with other children, identifying the parts of body, identifying family members, friends etc and started socializing with others. Now he is speaking clearly and able to call 'AVVA', 'APPA', 'AJJA'. Now parents are putting efforts to improve his communication skill. His parents are so happy with his developmental stages and becoming less dependency in her daily activities.





#### Abhishek Hamapattan, Mundaragi Taluk

He stepped in to BDT at the age of 3 year, and was diagnosed with Developmental Delay in Anganawadi Centre of Mundaragi Taluk. He was slow in his developmental stages like sitting, crawling &walking and was under weight. Due to constant follow-up & intervention the child has developed the activities like feeding, toileting, playing with other children, identifying the parts of body, identifying family members, friends, small things and gained weight. He is now participating in group activities, improved communication with parents etc. His parents are very happy with his improvements and less dependency in his daily activities.
