The main objective of this project is to reduce the incidence and prevent communicable and noncommunicable diseases that are common in the elderly population hospitalized in the São Vicente de Paulo Asylum in the city of Jandaia do Sul will provide a better quality of life for inmates with the purchase of equipment. special for the comfort and well-being and to promote training for the employees of this entity, for the better handling of the equipment and the best care with the interns.

Who will be the beneficiaries of this allowance? Provide the estimated number of direct beneficiaries.

They will be the elderly of the São Vicente de Paulo Asylum of Jandaia do Sul. Today the institution has 78 (seventy-eight) inmates.

What activities will the grant fund?

It will finance the purchase of various materials that will be possible to prevent various diseases presented in elderly people who are hospitalized in the entity, especially in bedridden, improving the quality of life of the inmates of the institution.

This project consists of purchasing hospital beds, pneumatic mattresses, bath chairs, wheelchair meal trays, electric oil heaters, cabinets, reclining armchairs and wheelchairs for the elderly of Asylum São Vicente de Paulo de Jandaia do South, to keep the environment in which the beneficiaries live healthy, to improve the comfort when they are bedridden and sitting, besides the thermal comfort at the moment after the bath and will also facilitate the handling of the inmates by the health team. And all employees who work directly with the items covered by this project, will receive specific training on how to handle the equipment by its suppliers and also by a health worker of the municipality, where it will be explained how it should be used, cleaning and maintenance. materials for greater project efficiency.

What community needs will the project address and how have those needs been identified? Provide relevant data or search results.

The project will meet the needs of the elderly who are hospitalized in the Sao Vicente de Paulo Asylum of Jandaia do Sul, improving health in the treatment and prevention of diseases providing better welfare for the elderly.

The needs were identified through meetings with health professionals from the city of Jandaia do Sul. Through these meetings it was found that the Asylum São Vicente de Jandaia do Sul institution needs to develop a project for prevention and control, prevention and treatment of internal diseases such as decubitus bedsores, falls with fractures, immobility of age. Following this need, a committee of 10 Rotarians from the Jandaia do Sul Rotary Club was set up and a meeting was held with the board of the institution, where a visit to the institution's premises was made, noting the needs presented in locum. by the inmate assistance staff.

Through this visit and meetings with the São Vicente de Paulo Asylum Board, several deficiencies of the institution were observed to provide decent accommodation for the inmates, as most suffer from mental disorders, are dependent on life-sustaining medications, the vast majority. Inmates suffer from mobility problems classified as wheelchair users and / or bedridden, are often lonely without the support of family members or someone specific to assist them.

Explain how your project will meet such community needs.

The Sao Vicente de Paulo Asylum of Jandaia do Sul has a large number of bedridden inmates using mattresses unsuitable for bedridden and in precarious conditions. Making it impossible for these inmates to stay in the same position for a long time facilitating the appearance of decubitus ulcers (sores) that was found during the visit of the team of Rotarians a large number of inmates with the disease.

It is very important to include in this project cabinets, where currently the inmates use collective clothes, where with this situation is possible the transmission of parasitic and infectious diseases between them. If they are individualized cabinets they can promote cleanliness and prevent various types of communicable diseases such as fungal diseases such as mycoses,

bacterial diseases such as pyoderma, parasitic diseases such as scabies, viral diseases like Herpes Zoster and others.

The institution has only one hospital bed in poor condition and it is not possible to raise or lower the head of the bed as the patient needs, remembering that the capacity is 80 inmates, they are in inadequate beds for treatment and staff if make them unable to practice proper patient management care and drug administrations such as infusing "serum" to patients and even sanitizing becomes difficult.

The upholstered recliner armchairs adapted to transport are extremely important for the welfare of the elderly, where it will be possible to mobilize the interns of the bed and transport them with the armchairs, facilitating access to outside areas such as sunbathing, social activities. and recreation, decreasing physical inactivity found during the visit and being one of the main complaints from Asylum users, companions and staff.

The institution has many Grade 2 and 3 wheelchairs, where some are amputated and have lost full limb movement and with the reclining wheelchairs will allow the autonomy of transport with comfort, as many inmates can not stay in the chair for a long time. normal wheels making their normal activities unfeasible, some cannot stay more than 2 hours in the ordinary wheelchair.

It is very important to purchase bath chairs for the São Vicente de Paulo Jandaia do Sul Asylum, as the institution has some, but are in very poor condition, putting at risk the elderly to fall and have some limb fracture, and also the lack of these chairs in the institution, makes it necessary for the moment of bathing inmates with mobility difficulties the presence of 2 caregivers to do this task, and yet, the inmates are afraid of falling and many of them do not. They like to shower because of their fear.

With the purchase of meal trays for wheelchair users, greater hygiene will be possible at the time of feeding, as many inmates do not have motor coordination and end up dropping food on the clothes and floor, changing the clothes of the inmate and will still be possible to maintain a cleaner and more pleasant environment.

The importance of purchasing heaters in the project is because inmates are housed in rooms with 3 to 4 beds and only one bathroom for every 2 rooms. These bathrooms are considered cold environments and after the inmates leave the hot water shower suffer the thermal variation, which can cause several problems inherent in hypothermia of the elderly. Even when cold, these heaters can help warm the entire environment by improving comfort and facilitating the smooth functioning of the circulatory system and decreasing joint stiffness.

A partnership will also be made with the Health Department of Jandaia do Sul, where a health professional will train employees who will have access to the equipment contemplated by this project, for the best handling of the project, teaching how to clean it. and equipment maintenance to extend the life of equipment purchased through this project. And training will also be done by the supplier of the purchased equipment.

How were community members involved in project planning? Does the project align with any local activities already underway?

Asylum Board of Directors Vincent de Paul of Jandaia do Sul, together with their collaborators made the list of items that contemplates this project, after which a meeting with the board was scheduled and the needs passed to the group of 10 Rotarians. of the club.

The beneficiary entity has existed in Jandaia do Sul since December 31, 1961 and has been providing uninterrupted services since that date. It is maintained by volunteer employees through financial donations and services and by contributions from the transfer of social security of some inmates.

By the proposal all equipment purchased will be used by it to improve the quality of life of inmates in health promotion through disease prevention and treatment.

Describe any trainings, community campaigns or educational programs (if applicable) and state who will do them. As the audience will be selected?

Training on the use of mattresses, armchairs, hospital beds, wheelchair and bath, meal tray and heaters will be given by the suppliers.

A partnership will be made with the Department of Health of the municipality of Jandaia do Sul,

where a health professional in the municipality will give training on how to use the equipment contemplated by this project, cleaning and maintaining it, for its greater durability. The target audience will be volunteers and employees of the beneficiary entity.

FOCUS AREAS

Health and disease prevention.

Promote prevention and treatment programs to limit the spread of communicable diseases and reduce the incidence and complications of noncommunicable diseases.

What goals will your activity support?

Disease prevention by promoting assistance in the mobility of inmates, equipment to prevent bedsores, stabilization of body temperature and infectious diseases.

How will you achieve these goals?

With individual lockers it will be possible to eliminate existing illnesses by wearing collective clothing such as infections, mycoses, etc.

With pneumatic mattresses, we will be able to prevent the emergence of bedsores.

With the movable reclining armchairs, we can take out the bed inmates for sunbathing, improving vitamin D production, facilitating socialization and physical exercise.

With hospital beds, we will be able to give a decent treatment to the interns, facilitating all the necessary care of the institution's staff with the patient, giving a better working environment for the staff and thus avoiding the high number of removal from the institution's employees due to spinal problems.

With bath chairs, we can prevent possible fall of the inmates in the bath environment, as many inmates over osteoporosis, which makes recovery in the event of breakages.

Meal Trays will greatly assist wheelchair users who have good motor coordination, so they drop food on their clothes and on the floor at mealtime. When these foods fall to the ground, they end up making the cafeteria environment conducive to flies and cockroaches and making the place unhygienic.

With reclining wheelchairs, we can alleviate the chronic pain that the inmates have in the spine so that they can stay longer in the chair, socializing between the inmates and staying less time in the room, a more closed environment, conducive to onset of disease.

With heaters it will be possible to have a more thermally pleasant environment, thereby reducing the rate of flu, colds, pneumonia, circulatory and joint problems.

With training received from equipment suppliers and the Health Department on how to maintain and clean equipment in order to increase project sustainability, institution employees will be better prepared for handling with the elderly and older people. This training he will be able to apply not only to the institution he works for today, but this knowledge the employees will take for their entire lives.

The São Vicente de Paulo Asylum was selected through meetings with health professionals from the city of Jandaia do Sul, where the club was given the various needs that the institution needs, through which a site visit was carried out with a group of 10 Rotarians, where there was a great need for project items.

The institution has a staff specialized in caring for the elderly, today composed of 26 employees, namely: 2 cooks, 2 laundry assistants, 4 nursing technicians, 13 caregivers, 1 social worker, 1 physical therapist, 1 nurse, 1 driver, 1 administrative assistant and several people from the community who volunteer at the institution.

The institution will collaborate with the maintenance of the equipment purchased, as the employees will have received training in handling, care and maintenance from suppliers and also from the Health Department of Jandaia do Sul.
