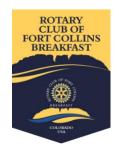

About our school

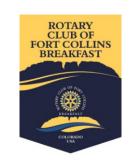

- 4. Toys & play tools and musical instruments like band set.









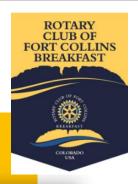

The students come from agricultural families of low socioeconomic status and there are 11 teachers. The assessment done with teachers, community members and identified the areas of improvement for the school to enhance the teaching efficiency, basic infrastructure like toilets for boys & girls, safe drinking water, flooring, benches and desks.
