This Montreal-based NGO has been working in Peru over the past 50 years.

They have completed several hundred water projects on the coast, in the Andes, and in the Amazon basin of Peru.

Since 2000, Les Ailes has installed approx. 25 water projects near Barranca, all of which are currently still functioning. Tens of thousands of people now have clean water.

All water projects are only undertaken if there is a local water committee composed of at least 50% women from the community.

All community members are given training on hygiene and the proper use of potable water.

The community will contribute many hours of unskilled labour toward the project.


Our project in La Tablada will be similar to our past water project at Nueva Esperanza, with a drilled well, an elevated water tank and a solar-powered pump
