SERIOUS HEALTH PROBLEMS IN THE POPULATION


- 1 Increase in the prevalence of gastrointestinal diseases in the entire adult and child.
- 2 Low level of education in children due to high level of absenteeism from school due to illnesses resulting from not having drinking water.
- 3 In general, the population is a vulnerable indigenous community that is dedicated to agriculture in small food gardens and fishing, activities that are affected by gastrointestinal diseases, affecting the family economy and increasing poverty.

The Project: Treatment water plant - taking advantage of the facilities








Drinking water treatment plant 3 liters per second Capacity, taking advantage of the facilities (two elevated tank. Filter tank and control room). We Will be installed submersible well pump and circulation-transfer pump, second a primary filtration, deaeration, fine filtration, meter, chlorination and distribution system, include the recoat of two elevated reinforced concrete storage tanks for treated water with a capacity of 8 and 12 m3 for the central area and supply and installation of others elevated plastic treated water storage tanks of 6 m3 supported on a reinforced concrete plate for the distant area. In addition, The installation of a solar plant is required to supply energy to the entire electrical system to provide continuity of energy service and reliability to the PTAP for its operation.

SUSTAINABILITY

ASOLAGOS E.S.P. workers in charge of managing and keeping the plant in operation, will be trained and qualified to operate and carry out the care, cleaning, and basic maintenance of the equipment.

Training to the community in drinking water supply, basic sanitation, hygiene development and rational use of water.

Training on the importance of the quality of the provision of domestic public water service and knowledge and application of the Colombian Tariff System to Billing.

Most of the equipment's are static equipment that does not require specialist maintenance technicians. With good operation, counterflow washing and periodic cleaning tasks is enough to have them in continuous and permanent operation. The pumps and the solar plant are very common equipment in the area that already has workshops and technicians for their maintenance and repair with easily available spare parts.

The beneficiaries agree to install the micrometers and pay a minimum cost to receive water services and an additional value according to the consumption recorded in their micrometer and additional cost for maintenance of the facilities, equipment and supplies to guarantee the sustainability of the project.
